PHASE 1: Complete Projects 1 - 5

2014 Neurer Pond



Stormwater basin and native vegetation enhance Beaver Dam Lake water quality.

Grants \$245,108

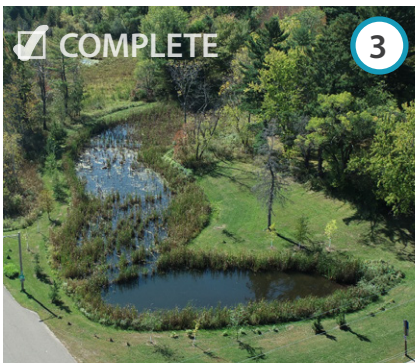
2016 Northeast Wetland



Stormwater treatment and wildlife habitat improve the health of Library Lake.

Grants \$267,300

2018 Southwest Wetland



Wetland system filters surface runoff, protecting local wetlands and lakes.

Grants \$271,198 + Land Donation



2021 Southeast Stormwater Pond



Stormwater pond captures and treats runoff before flowing into Library Lake.

Grants \$478,200

2023 Southeast Stormwater Park



Stormwater treatment chain includes bioretention basins and an iron-enhanced sand filter for water quality.

Grants \$336,187

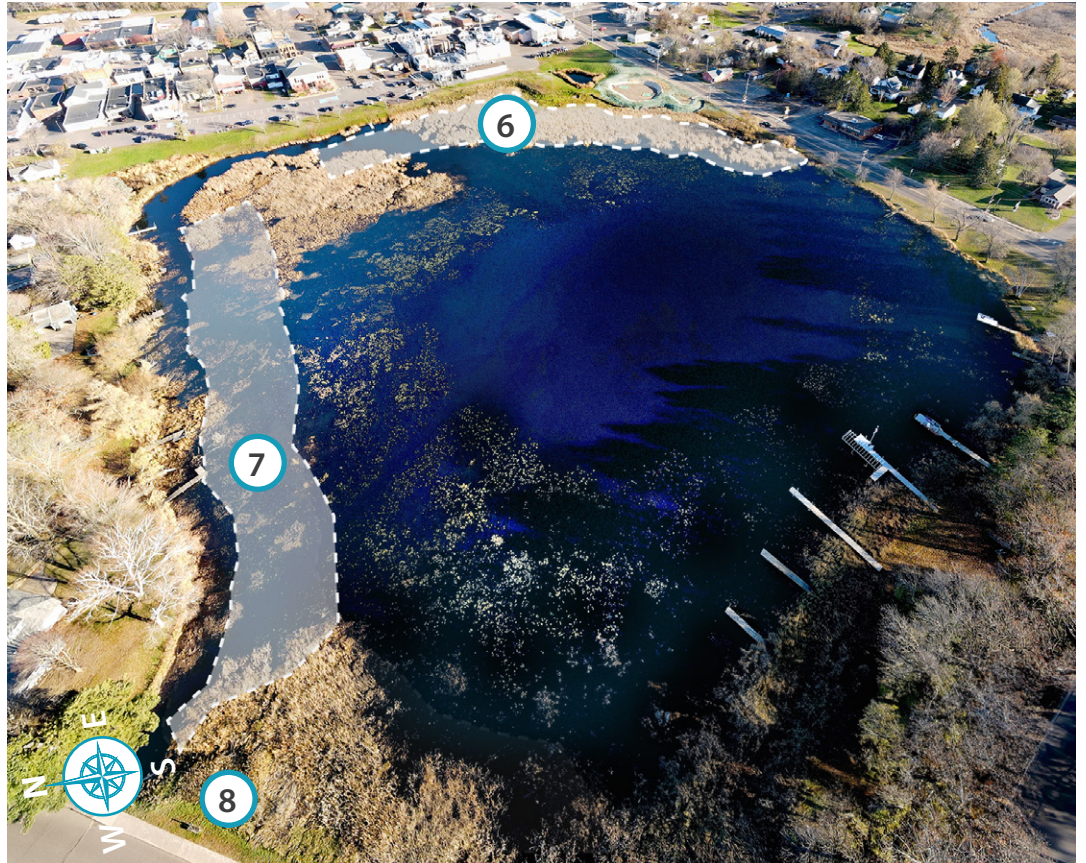
PHASE 2: Library Lake Dredging 2024

North + Southeast Dredging Areas 6 7

Removing 1,000 dump trucks (150 train cars) of cattails and years of accumulated sludge will provide better boat access to Downtown Cumberland, improve fish spawning habitat, create new fishing opportunities, and enhance shoreline health.

Grove Street Bridge 8

Channel clearing opens Downtown Cumberland to all boat traffic (including pontoons), especially during upcoming Summer 2025 Main Street (Highway 63) construction / closure.
